Organised by Care England, which is the leading representative body for independent care services in England, together with the Foundation for Nursing Studies, the scheme is only open to care homes, like ours, which have rated 'Good' and above by the CQC (Care Quality Commission.)

Our collaboration will offer tangible benefits to the care experience and outcomes for residents and their families, and to the learning and development opportunities within the care sector."

Our Director of Clinical Services, Karen Johnson, and Clinical Manager, Sue Cleary, recently attended the first day of training for the scheme in London, and gave a presentation about The Fed to other participating care homes.




